Our goal is to provide innovative and family-centered programs. We offer a variety of services, including home visiting programs and support services. With funding from a variety of sources and community agencies, First Step Family Support Center strives to meet the needs of parents, families, and their children in a respectful and responsive manner.

The **First Step Supported Parenting Project** is a program that serves parents with cognitive limitations who are raising their children. Family Support Workers visit the families at least once a week to work with families on child safety issues (how to keep your baby/child safe), child development issues, (understanding how kids grow and how important parents are in helping their kids reach their potential), child advocacy issues (how parents are their kids first teacher and most important advocate in life) and on building a strong support network for our families. We work with families who live in various parts of our county. We also work with the schools to help teachers and staff in the schools understand that parents with cognitive limitations may need school staff to explain school related issues to them in a different way so that it makes sense to the parents.
